This summer, in preparation for English 8, you'll be reading *The Book Thief* by Markus Zusak, a moving, at times funny, and often thought-provoking story about a girl living in Germany during World War II. As you read, consider issues of **justice**, **friendship**, **sympathy**, and **power** that arise in the novel. It would be a good idea to annotate as you read. When you're done reading, think about the following questions. These are issues we'll discuss when school starts:

- Who is the story's narrator and what impact does that have on the story?
- How does the relationship between Liesl and her adoptive parents develop over the course of the story?
- Liesl has very important friendships with three characters in the novel: Hans (her stepfather),
 Rudy, and Max. What draws her to each of these people? Which specific moments seem to
 solidify the bond she has with each of them? And why?
- How does the title relate to the story? Why do books take on such a significance in the story?

You should be prepared to take a quiz on the novel in the second class in September. We will also write an essay on the novel together, as a class.
