APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS PRE-K AND KINDERGARTEN

We are so pleased you have decided to apply to Manlius Pebble Hill School. Our highly personalized admissions process helps us learn more about your child, and determine whether the MPH environment will be good match for them at this stage in their development. To get started, please follow these steps:

Submit an application by visiting *mphschool.org/Admissions* and clicking on the blue "Apply Now" tab on the right side of the screen. A \$60 application fee is due at the time of submission.

Complete the enclosed Early Learning Parent Questionnaire and return to the Office of Admissions.

Sign the top of the enclosed Teacher Assessment and give it to your child's current instructor or daycare provider. Forms should be returned directly to the MPH Admissions Office. This requirement is waived for children who are not currently enrolled in a daycare or program.

Refer to the instructions in the enclosed "Let's Play" guide to complete and record some play-based readiness exercises with your child. Share your recordings with MPH by following the directions at the end of the guide.

Admissions staff will keep parents informed of applicable application deadlines and decision dates, which can vary by year based on the number of available spaces and admissions demand.

Because space can be limited, we advise submitting your child's application materials as early as possible for the best chance of securing a space in the fall class. Eligibility: Children who will have turned three years old by June 1 are eligible to apply for the fall Pre-K program. Children who will turn five years old by December 1 are eligible to apply for the fall Kindergarten program.

Being potty-trained is a requirement for children entering the program in the fall.

Teacher Assessment

Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten



Overview:

Our goal is to learn more about your child. By sharing with us videos of you and your child engaging in some simple, play-based readiness activities, we can gain a sense of their individuality, as well as their own unique set of strengths and challenges. Please be assured that we understand every child will engage with the activities differently...and that is okay! Even an *attempt* at an exercise will be helpful for us to see, even if your child isn't able to complete the exercise correctly. *Have fun!*

Instructions:

There are five sections of activities. Each section should be recorded as its own video clip and shared with MPH according to the instructions provided on Page 3.

ACTIVITIES:

Video #1: Visual/Motor Planning

A. Using five blocks, build the below structure (without showing your child how it is built). Give your child five blocks and ask them to build the same structure. If balancing the middle block is too challenging, set that block so it sits "⊠" straight instead.



B. Draw a circle, "X," square, and triangle on a piece of paper. Show your child the four figures and ask your child to try drawing each themselves. Please film your child drawing so teachers can observe their pencil grip. (Please note that a triangle is tricky.)

Video #2: Visual/Sequential Memory

A. Using three simple picture cards from your home, show your child the order of the pictures **face up** on the table. Flip the pictures over (face down) and ask the child where each picture is. Have your child flip over the picture to check their guess.

Video #3: Language and Cognition

- A. Show your child a group of five (5) items (e.g., pennies, Cheerios, or other). Ask your child to count them and tell you how many are in the group "all together."
- B. Show your child two (2) objects (one at a time): BUTTON and a BLOCK...and for each, ask them to answer the questions:
 *What is it?
 *What color is it?
 *What shape is it?
 *What do you use it for? / What do you do with it?
- C. Ask your child to complete the sentences:

*Brother is a boy, sister is a *A horse is big, a mouse is *A table is made of wood, a window is made of *A bird flies, a fish

- D. Ask your child to repeat the following numbers after you:
 - *9,3 *5,1,6 *2,7,4,9

Video #4: Speech

A. Ask your child to try saying or singing "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star."

(Twinkle, twinkle, little star, how I wonder what you are. Up above the world so high, like a diamond in the sky. Twinkle, twinkle little star, how I wonder what you are.)

B. Ask your child to describe their favorite toy and share why they love to play with it and what makes it special.

Video #5: Gross Motor Play

["Now we're going to play some standing-up games."]

- A. Ask your child to balance on one foot as you count to 10. Ask your child to balance on the other foot as you count to 10.
- B. Ask your child to hop on one foot five times. Ask your child to hop on the other foot five times.

Share your videos with MPH!

- 1. Download the app: "<u>Collect</u>" (by We Transfer) and establish an account. *Note: If you are immediately prompted to purchase an upgrade, simply hit the "Skip" button.*
- 2. Click on the "+" sign to "Create New Board," and name your board using your child's first initial and last name. Then, click "Create."
- 3. Tap the "+" sign again and choose "Photos or Videos." Select the videos you want to share and click "Add."
- 4. Click "Share," and then choose "View Only," at which point the app will provide the familiar icon choices.
- 5. Choose the email icon, and the app will automatically generate a hyperlink to your video (Board) in the body of an email message.
- 6. Change the subject line to read: "Confidential for Admissions-[Name of your child]."
