DRIVER EDUCATION

(IN-PERSON ONLY - MPH CAMPUS)

Driver Education begins July 1 and runs 8 weeks. Students must be 16 years old by July 1 and possess a valid driving permit. Students attend theory and drive classes twice a week, 1.5 hours each class/drive (six hours per week), for 8 weeks to complete the required 24 hours of in-class and incar requirements regulated and approved through the NYS Department of Motor Vehicles. Theory classes and behindthe-wheel instruction taught by certified driver education instructors.

Upon completion of the course, students will receive an MV-285 Student Certificate of Completion from New York



State. This certificate includes the NY pre-licensing 5-hour course requirements, an insurance reduction certificate, and allows 17-year-old drivers to upgrade to a senior license. Our goal is to teach our students to be the most responsible, safe drivers possible.

SAT PREPARATION COURSE

(ONLINE ONLY)

SAT Preparation Course runs July 2 through July 30 on Tuesdays and Thursdays (no class July 4), 6:00-9:00 p.m. All classes are recorded and will be available up to 7 days if a class is missed. The SAT Preparation course offers 24 hours of scheduled verbal and math instruction, focusing on strategies and problem solving on how to best manage time while taking the exam. COLLEGE APPLICATION ESSAY

(ONLINE ONLY)

ENTERING GRADES 11 and 12

Dates/Times: July 8-12

9:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m.

Fee: \$350/week

The essay portion of the college application can be a source of anxiety, but it is really an opportunity to shine! MPH English teacher and NYTimes published essayist, Amy Doyle, can help demystify the process in this workshop that offers practical tips and individualized coaching. On day one, the full group will meet to review the essay topics offered on the Common Application, as well as examine sample essays of successful applicants to discern what works. On days 2-4, students will



have individual conference time to brainstorm a story that college admissions officers have never read, creating an "image outline" for an essay that will bring to life their intelligence, humor, and tenderness. On day 5, students will tune up their drafts with direct instruction on how to start paragraphs, how to develop and connect ideas, how to create an appropriate and resonant tone, and how to brighten their writing with strong verbs and vivid details. Limit 8 students each week.

COUNSELOR-IN-TRAINING FOR SUMMER DAY CAMP

ENTERING GRADES 9-12

Dates/Times: July 1 -August 9, Weeks 1-6, 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. Fee: \$185/week (Register for some or all weeks.)

Our Counselor-in-Training camp is a great way to learn the ropes of working at summer camp or other children's programs. CITs will work under the direction of our Assistant Summer Camp Director to assist in activity block classes with lead counselors and other duties as assigned. CITs will have special training sessions with MPH Heads of Lower and Middle School (working with campers in grades 1-8), Head of Student Life (Leadership) and School Nurse (First Aid). Limit 10 students each week.

Please note that MPH only hires summer counselor "floater" candidates who have graduated from high school unless they have worked for our school-year extended day program. Offering the summer CIT program will allow students an opportunity to train as a floater and possible employment at the age of 18 (dependent on performance and job openings).
